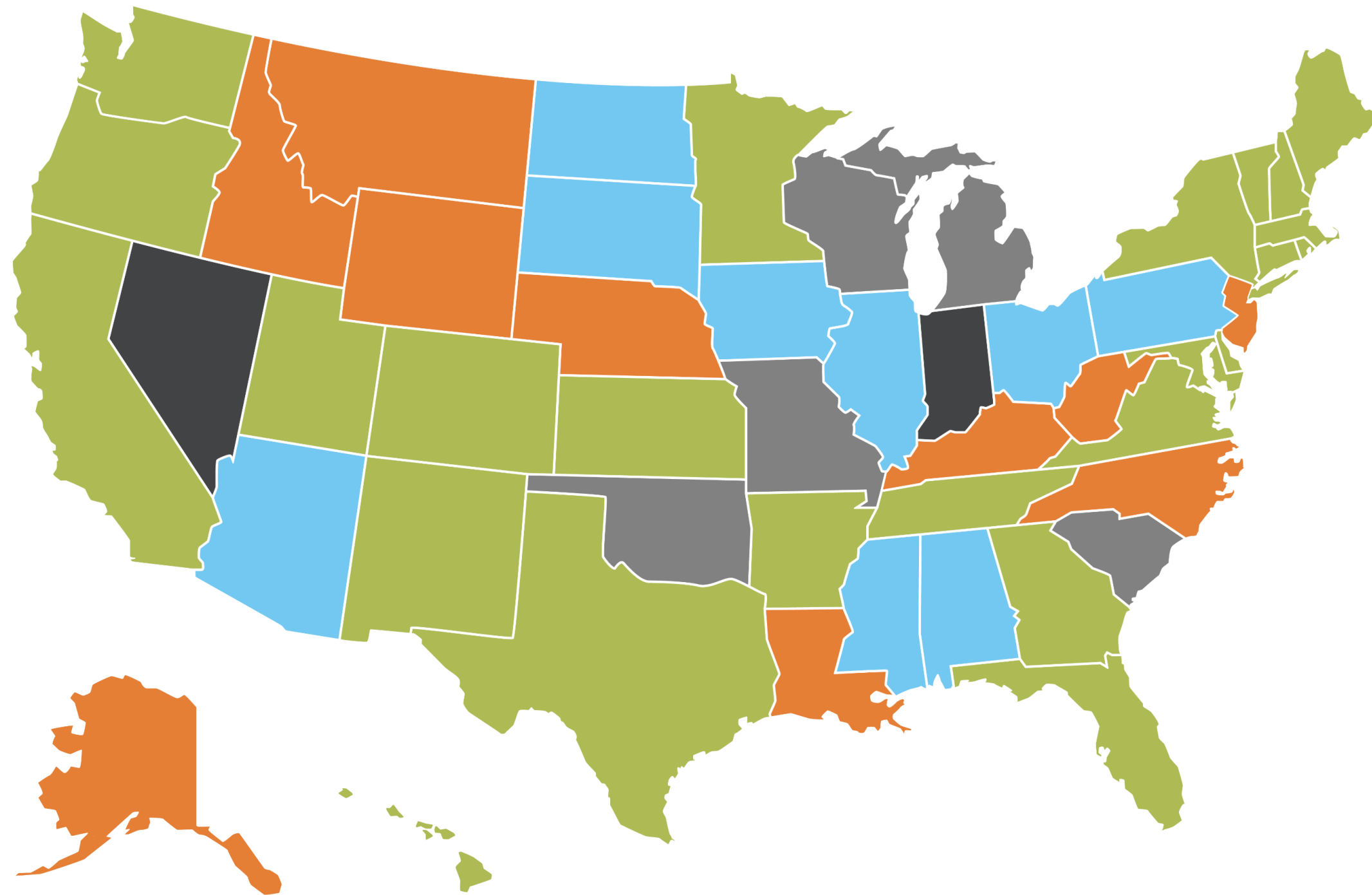
All Payer Claims Databases Overview

APCDs are large databases that typically include medical, professional, and pharmacy claims collected from private and public payers. Advantages over single-payer or population-based databases include:

- Capturing longitudinal care information on individuals across plans
- Patient data that spans care settings and health systems
- Data from most or all insurance companies in state
- Demographic, diagnostic, procedural & reimbursement information (total charges, plan paid, and patient responsibility)
 - Useful for policy, research, clinical and health system performance, evaluation, population health management, system redesign, payment reform, and more

APCDs Do Not Contain

Generally, APCD's do not contain information for:

- Federally Insured:
 - Federal Employees Health Benefits Plans (FEHP)
 - Veterans Administration
 - Indian Health Services
 - Tri-care
 - Department of Defense Plans
- Uninsured
- Employees of self-funded, ERISA-covered employers who do not voluntarily submit data



Spectrum of APCDs

- Voluntary submission
- State submission only
- No public data release, limited use cases and users.

- Mandatory submission
- CDL field submission
- Moderate allowable data release and use cases
- Limited data integration
- Limited State use cases

More Robust

Less Robust

- Limited mandatory submission
- Limited field submission
- Limited allowable data release and use cases

- Mandatory submission
- Fields beyond CDL collected
- Files beyond CDL collected
- Broad allowable data release and use cases
- Integration with other state and public data sources
- Robust use in policy, public health, insurance, etc.



Six Critical Functions of an APCD

Reporting on health care spending, utilization, and performance

Enhancing state policy and regulatory analysis

Informing the public about health care prices and policy

Enabling value-based purchasing and health care improvement

Supporting public health monitoring and improvement

Providing reliable data for health care research and evaluation

Overview of the CO APCD

- Claims for over 5.5 million lives monthly, bimonthly processing
- Commercial, Medicare Advantage, Medicare FFS and Medicaid
 - CIVHC was one of the first QE's and manages the state agency authorization for the state of Colorado.
- 10+ million lives in total (2013 to present)
- 10-15 public reporting releases annually plus almost 200 releases of free data sets to improve access
- Over 100 non-public releases annually

What is Submitted to the CO APCD

Monthly:

- Medical Claims
- Professional Claims
- Pharmacy Claims
- Dental Claims
- Vision Claims
- Eligibility Files
 - Including premium, deductible, and employer contribution
 - ERISA indicator

Annually:

- Drug Rebate file
- Brand, Specialty, Generic by count and spend
- By therapeutic class
- Alternative Payment Models
- By HCP-LAN category, including spend, count, and provider specialty
- Narrative Contract File
- Value-Based Pharmaceutical Contracts
- Prescription Drug Affordability Board



CIVHC Assigned Identifiers and Value Adds

Assigned Identifiers:

- **Claim ID:** A set of claim lines representing an original, submitted claim
- **Member ID:** A specific member contract per payer
- **Person ID:** An individual across contracts and payers
- **Provider ID:** A specific provider; 1:1 NPI to Provider ID when NPI available
- **Pharmacy ID:** A specific pharmacy; 1:1 NPI to Pharmacy ID when NPI available

Value Adds to CO APCD:

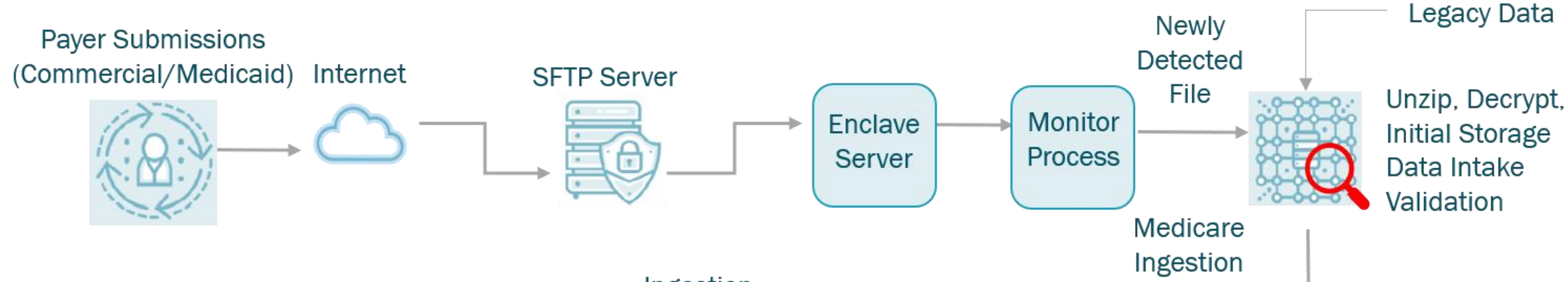
- Emergency Department Flag
- Out of Network Flag
- Dual-eligible Flag
- APR-DRGs
- Johns Hopkin's ACGs
- Length of Stay field for inpatient stays
- Sequencing of the dataset for robust use without dates of service
- Geocoding of people and providers allowing census tract level analyses



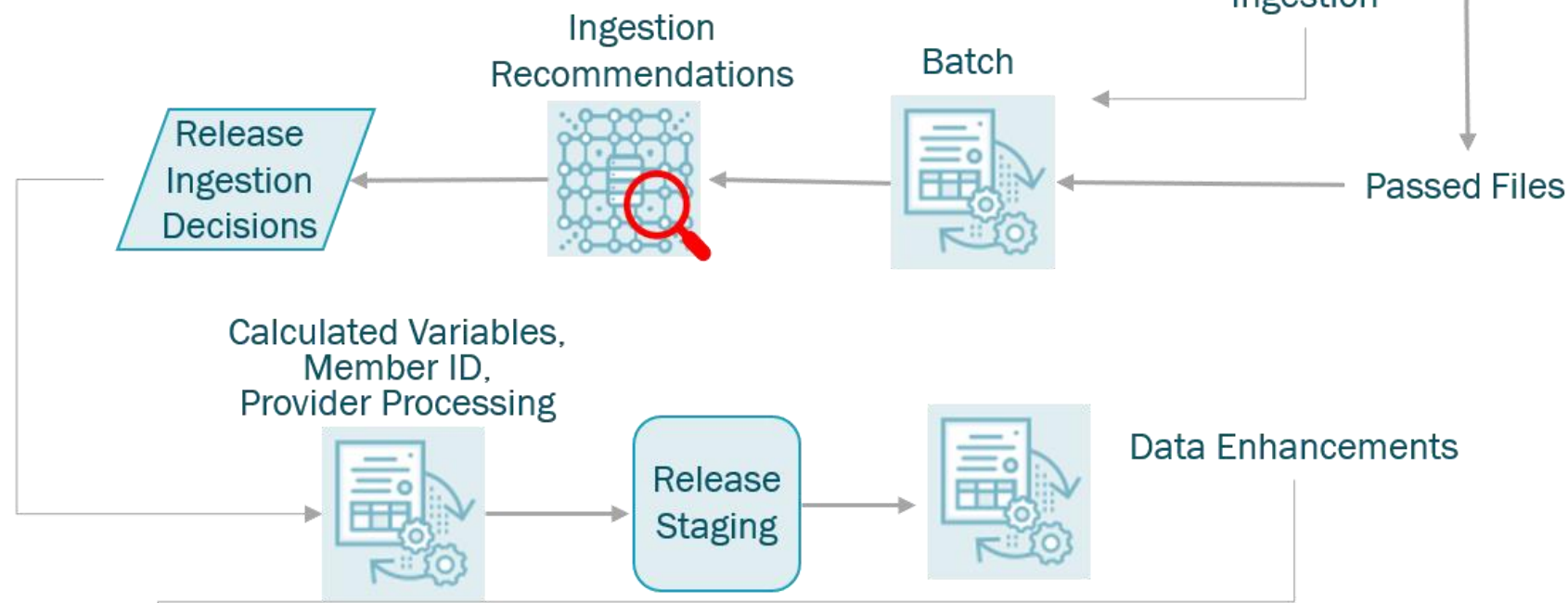

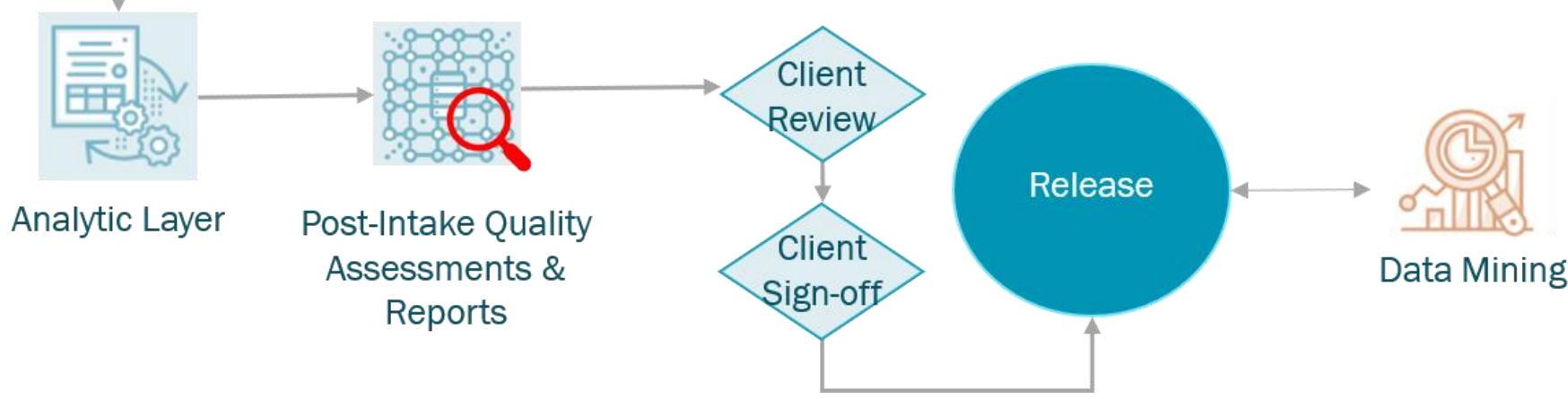

Partnership with State and Legislators

- More than 60 reports and data sets delivered annually, plus CO State Data Mart
- CO APCD data to support implementing and evaluating policy:
 - Out-of-Network payments
 - Colorado Option
 - Prescription Drug Affordability Board
 - Primary Care Initiatives
- CO APCD data to support pending legislation:
 - Firearms Injury Analysis
 - ED for Mental Health
 - Impact of Ozone/Wildfires on Health



CO APCD Non-Public Data Projects by Sector FY 2018-2019 through FY 2022-2023

Non-public Data Partners

Examples include:

- **Researchers:** Evaluate patterns and impact of Long COVID-19
- **Employer Alliance:** Payment data for rate setting/negotiations
- **Community Based Organization:** Understand factors contributing to maternal health disparities
- **Digital Health:** Investigate high volume prescription drugs by payer to advance prescription drug affordability
- **Government Agencies:** Evaluate utilization of care to understand provider workforce shortages
- **Health Plan:** Improve access to high-quality oral health care for pregnant women, infants, and children

Community Based Organizations

- ✓ Compare rural/urban regions and identify policy needs (*Telehealth Services Analysis*)
- ✓ Improve client services (*Low Value Care*)
- ✓ Understand drug rebates and pricing to reduce costs (*Prescription Drug Rebates*)

- ✓ Compare prices by hospital and insurance company (*Shop for Care*)

- **Telligen (QIN-QIO):**
 - Ongoing work over 10+ years – joint community engagement, education and outreach, defined roles over time in areas of expertise.
 - CIVHC High-Value Care at End of Life
- **Contexture (HIE):**
 - Orange Flag Project - Targeting high-risk individuals in need of social and medical support and intervention
 - MPI – Master Patient Index to align CO data across aggregating entities for increased utilization and insights.
- **Colorado Community Managed Care Network:**
 - Supporting rural connectivity – CO APCD data at population level for providers, identifiable patient level view of clinical/claims data.
- **Social Health Information Exchange:**
 - Developing intake capability, planned program evaluation and public analyses
