Health Data Utility Key Characteristics

- Serves as a health information exchange and partners with state agencies, payers, and public health departments
- Integrates clinical and non-clinical data for actionable insights and improved care coordination
- Adapts to changes and builds trust by demonstrating ROI and addressing evolving healthcare needs
